Marilyn Monroe dress sells for \$4.6 million

Marilyn Monroe in "The Seven Year Itch" Everett Collection The legendary white dress seen billowing under Marilyn Monroe in an iconic image of 1950s Hollywood has sold at auction for \$4.6 million, shattering estimates.

The dress, worn by the star in the 1955 film "The Seven Year Itch," had been expected to fetch between one and two million dollars. But the recent sale, part of a collection of Hollywood memorabilia held by actress Debbie Reynolds, saw Monroe's "subway" dress -- now cream colored from age -- sold for \$4.6 million (or \$5,520,000, with added fees).

The entire sale, which included other Monroe garbs, was valued at \$22.8 million,



Firecracker Fried Chicken Drumsticks

Ingredients

- 8 chicken drumsticks
- 1/4 cup hot pepper sauce
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 tablespoons yellow cornmeal
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups vegetable oil for frying

Directions:


To Marinate: Remove skin from chicken and place in a resealable plastic bag. Pour sauce over chicken, seal bag and refrigerate to marinate for at least 1 hour, up to 24 hours. The longer the chicken marinates, the spicier it will be.

In another resealable plastic bag combine the flour, cornmeal and salt.



Add chicken, seal bag and shake to coat.

Heat oil in a large, deep skillet to medium high heat. Add chicken and fry, uncovered, for 25 to 30 minutes or until juices run clear. Turn occasionally to brown evenly.

Brown Sugar Baked Beans



- 4 slices bacon, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup chili sauce
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 2 (21-ounce) cans pork and beans
- 2 tablespoons country-style Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

- 1/4 teaspoon hot pepper sauce

DIRECTIONS:

Heat oven to 325°F. Cook bacon in 10-inch skillet over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally, until bacon is browned (4 to 6 minutes). Place bacon on paper towel to drain.

Combine cooked bacon and all remaining ingredients in large bowl. Pour into ungreased 2-quart casserole. Bake, stirring occasionally, for 1 1/2 to 2 hours or until slightly thickened.

Nancy Seltzer, a spokeswoman for auction house Profiles in History, told AFP in an email.

Signed by the American designer William Travilla, the pleated ivory dress contributed in part to Monroe's enduring image as a 20th Century sex symbol.

It was the highest value feature of the auction that also some 700 pieces go under the hammer.

Among them were dresses Monroe wore in "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes" (1953) and "The River of No Return" (1954), as well as costumes from other

classic Hollywood staples "Gone With the Wind," "The Sound of Music," "Cleopatra," "Ben-Hur," "The Wizard of Oz," and "My Fair Lady."

Reynolds, a singer, dancer and actress whose greatest role came in "Singin' in the Rain," began collecting Hollywood memorabilia in the 1970s when MGM Studios liquidated its assets. Her immense collection includes over 3,500 costumes, 20,000 photographs and hundreds of props and other decorations.

A second sale from the Reynolds collection is planned for December.

Michael Jackson 'Thriller' jacket fetches \$1.8M



BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) — A famed black-and-red calfskin jacket that Michael Jackson wore in the classic "Thriller" video has sold at auction for \$1.8 million.

The jacket is one of two Jackson wore during the filming of the 1983 "Thriller"

video. Jackson wears the jacket in a scene with a troupe of zombies who rise from their graves and break into a dance routine.

The jacket will be sent on tour and used as a fundraising tool for children's charities.

A portion of the sale price will go to the Shambala Preserve, a big cat sanctuary caring for two tigers Jackson one owned.



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Super Bowl ring auctioned to pay back taxes

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)—A former Green Bay Packers lineman whose teams won the first two Super Bowls will have at least one of his championship rings auctioned off to recover some of the \$1.7 million the federal government says he owes in back taxes.


Fuzzy Thurston, 77, played for the Packers from 1959 to 1967. Federal marshals have seized his Super Bowl II ring, and authorities are trying to track down his other Super Bowl ring along with other memorabilia to auction off in accordance with a court order.

Heritage Auctions of Dallas said the only items it has so far are Thurston's Super Bowl II ring, his 1960 Packers helmet and two 1960 footballs signed by members of the Packers and coach Vince Lombardi. "We hope to reach out to fans who might wish to purchase the material to return it to Thurston," said Chris Ivy, the auction house's director of sports auctions.

The ring will be auctioned at the National Sports Collectors Convention in Rosemont, Ill., on Aug. 4. The helmet and the footballs will be available in the Fall Heritage Sports auction, which closes Nov. 11.

The Super Bowl ring is expected to fetch at least \$20,000.

Other rings from the first two Super Bowls have also been sold in recent years. Running back Paul Hornung's Super Bowl I ring fetched about \$40,000 in 2002, while former offen



sive lineman Steve Wright sold his Super Bowl I ring last month for \$73,409.

Messages left at Thurston's Waupaca home weren't immediately returned. Green Bay lawyer Owen Monfils, who represented Thurston in some of his tax cases, told the Green Bay Press-Gazette he was certain Thurston didn't owe "nearly as much as the government claims."

The tax fight stems from Thurston's post-Packers days, when he and his business partners opened a chain of restaurants. According to a federal complaint, Thurston and the others withheld federal income taxes from employee salaries but failed to turn all the money over to the Internal Revenue Service.

After a court fight, Thurston was ordered to pay about \$190,000 in 1984. With interest, the debt now stands at just over \$1.7 million, according to court documents.

Al Capone's gun sold for \$109,079 at auction

The Colt .38 was made in May 1929. A revolver belonging to US gangster Al Capone has sold for \$109,079 at Christie's auction house in London.



The Colt .38 was made just months after Capone, known as Scarface, ordered the murder of seven of his rivals in the infamous St Valentine's Day Massacre.

The gun, which was made in May 1929, came with a letter signed by the

sister-in-law of Capone confirming its authenticity.

Capone dominated the Chicago underworld during prohibition until 1931.

He was arrested for tax evasion in that year and died in 1947.

Rare Billy the Kid photograph sold for \$2.3 million

DENVER (Reuters) - The only authenticated photograph of infamous Wild West gunslinger Billy the Kid was auctioned off to Florida billionaire William Koch for an \$2.3 million.

Koch, an energy company executive and well-known collector of art and American West artifacts, placed the winning bid in person before stunned onlookers at Brian Lebel's annual Old West Auction in Denver.

Lebel said at an auction preview that he expected the tintype image to sell for between \$300,000 and \$400,000. Koch told Reuters after the auction that he plans to allow some small museums to display the piece, and after that he will "just enjoy" the iconic piece.

"I love the old West," he said. "This is a part of American history."

The metallic photo, taken outside a Fort Sumner, New Mexico, saloon in late 1879 or early 1880, depicts the outlaw gripping the upright barrel of a Winchester carbine, with a Colt 45 pistol strapped to his hip.

The photograph was owned by the descendants of Dan Dedrick, who was given the photo by his cattle rustling partner, Billy the Kid himself.

Born Henry McCarty, but known in New Mexico as William Bonney, the Kid was shot dead at age 22 by lawyer Pat Garrett in 1881, months after a jailbreak in which Bonney reportedly killed two deputies.

In the 130 years since his death, Billy the Kid has been depicted, with varying degrees of accuracy, in scores of popular culture movies and books. Koch's winning bid was actually \$2



million, but a \$300,000 "buyer's premium" was tacked on, bringing the total selling price to \$2.3 million, an auction spokeswoman said.

Brian Lebel said he was pleased that the photo wasn't sold to an overseas buyer.

"I'm happy that it will stay in this country and will be shared with the public," he said. Koch is one of the sons of Fred C. Koch, founder of Wichita, Kansas-based energy conglomerate Koch Industries, one of the largest private companies in the United States.
